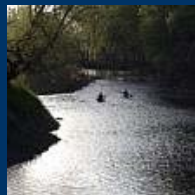
Get Involved - Help End Homelessness: Homeward 2020 seeks volunteers for Registry Week

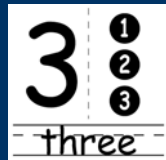
